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Heesen Yachts delivers 55m superyacht



Heesen Yachts has delivered the 55m (180ft) motoryacht *Serenity*.

Launched in Oss in the Netherlands, she completed sea trials in severe weather conditions during December.

Serenity is a milestone in the Dutch shipyard's history as she is the largest displacement vessel built there to date.

Her interior has been designed by Frank Laupman from Omega Architects while In-house Heesen naval architects worked closely with Van Oossanen and Associates to create the hull which has a trans-oceanic range of 6,000nm at 10kt.

"*Serenity's* hull form is the final development of the Heesen displacement hull form, which has already proven itself over the last 10 years," says Perry van Oossanen, of Van Oossanen and Associates.

"It is a good, comfortable and seaworthy hull, with a well-designed yet traditional flared bow."

Heesen's order book currently runs until 2015 and includes three full-displacement vessels.
